Vladyslava Magaletska bring over 15 years of extensive experience in agricultural policy and business, where she has served in various executive roles in both government agencies and private businesses. She brings with her an in-depth knowledge and expertise in the agricultural industry, strategic development, and experience in working with global entities, including the World Bank, International Finance Corp., and the European Union.

In her role as Senior Advisor, Vladyslava helps lead the strategy and expansion of Enterra's Autonomous Decision Sciences™ (ADS) Technology



and management practices in the Global Agricultural Value Chain (GAVC). She will assist in the development and implementation of specific GAVC optimization and decision-making capabilities in global food security and business resiliency applications for commercial sector and governmental agencies.

Most recently, Vladyslava served as the Deputy Minister of Food and Agriculture of Ukraine and Head of the State Service of Ukraine on Food Safety and Consumer Protection where she oversaw the management, development, and transformation of the State Service on food safety, sanitation, compliance, and consumer protections. While there, she successfully reformed the agency into a modern, transparent, and convenient service to protect the state, businesses, and consumers. She opened over 35 export markets for Ukrainian exporters and improved transparency in state supervision sanitary legislation compliance, food safety, digitalization, state regulation of pricing, phytosanitation, quality control and safety of school meals, and consumer rights protections.

Vladyslava also served as Vice President and Board Member at SigmaBleyzer, a \$1 billion investment fund, and AgroGeneration, a French-based company that focuses on recultivation and restructuring of farms primarily in France and the Ukraine. As a key member of their executive teams, she focused on strategy development, portfolio management, and mergers and acquisitions, where she led acquisitions across various business sectors, including a leading cable TV provider, a leading agricultural producer, and oil and gas exploration companies.

In 2014, after the EuroMaidan revolution, she helped to accelerate privatization, reform public administration, and attract foreign direct investment to Ukraine to support economic growth in her role as the Vice Minister of European integration for the Ministry of Agrarian Policy and Food of Ukraine.

Vladyslava also served as Vice President of the Union of Ukrainian Entrepreneurs, the largest association of the Ukrainian entrepreneurs, and Member of the National Council of Reform.

Vladyslava holds a Ph.D. in Cybernetics from the Taras Shevchenko National University and is an alumnus of the Emerging Leaders Program at Harvard University.
